# 2023 Festival of Bands General Information

## **Tickets and Spectator Parking:**

- General Admission for the Festival of Bands is \$15. Student/senior/military admission is \$10. If you buy 5 or more tickets the cost per ticket is \$10.00 Tickets can be purchased at the gate or in advance online at omb.uoregon.edu/festival-ofbands. We strongly advise people to purchase their tickets online to avoid delays at the gate.
- **Parking at Autzen Stadium is \$5 per vehicle, cash only.** Parking fees allow us to hire parking lot attendants who will keep the lot safe during the festival. Passes are good throughout the day, but do not guarantee a parking spot. Autzen parking passes are valid only in the Autzen East lot.

### Pre-Sales: Tickets, Programs and Merchandise

 Tickets can be purchased online both before and on the day of the event. We strongly advise people to purchase their tickets online to avoid delays at the gate.

# **Before You Arrive:**

- Information packets will be available when you arrive. These packets will include student wristbands and volunteer wrist bands They will also include ten 50% off coupons for additional volunteer tickets (available at the ticket booth at the South Entrance). Each school will also receive a minimum of 10 parking passes when the band checks in. Spectators may not park in the Band Parking area, all cars in the Band Parking area must be directly affiliated with band (i.e. staff or director vehicles, chaperones working directly with the band, etc.)
- Please read all maps and information you receive. Please contact your band guides before the day of the festival and trust them to have the information you need. *As a courtesy to the band on the field, please warm up only in designated areas, facing away from the stadium.*

# Arrival, Band Parking and Staging Area:

- Buses and equipment trucks should turn onto Leo Harris Blvd. on the West side of the stadium and enter the parking area through Entry 4. Spectator parking will enter through Entry 5. Parking lots open at 6 am.
- Overnight parking is not allowed in any of the parking lots at Autzen Stadium.

- Prop storage is available on the North Apron of the stadium. Please ensure that props are not blocking building or gate access. Car and truck access will not be available, so all props must be moved by hand or with a gator or golf cart.
- Props must fit through both entry tunnels and may not be in the stadium until your group's performance time. The tunnels are 6'9" tall and 10'6" wide.
- **Prop Movement:** After performances props may be stored on the stadium North Apron, in the area indicated on the Flow Of Show Map. Props may be re-staged after performance. After exiting through the East tunnel, turn left before exiting Through the East gate.
- Changing rooms and restrooms are available at Papé Field. Only some of the portable toilets will be open, please refer to the Flow of Show map for locations.
- First Aid is located outside the East Gate.
- We have several vendors and booths located in the South concourse, please encourage your students to visit them. Beacock Music will be in the South Concourse to provide emergency instrument repair.
- Our fabulous Autzen Stadium concessions will be available in the South Concourse.
- The Press Box is open to directors and their staff for field viewing and complimentary refreshments. Please be prepared to show NWAPA passes or wristbands to the monitor at the elevator in the South Concourse.
- Dumpsters will be placed throughout the band parking areas. Please let your band guides know if the dumpsters need emptied, your help in keeping the parking lot clean is greatly appreciated.

### Awards Retreat:

Prelims (Drum Majors, Captains); Finals (Drum Majors, Captains)

- **Prelims:** We will do a Drum Major retreat for the Preliminary Awards. All Drum Majors should report to the West Tunnel before the conclusion of the last preliminary performance (Century Marching Band approximately 4:00 pm). They will receive retreat instructions at that time.
- **Finals:** At the conclusion of the final competitive performance (about 9:20 pm) Drum Majors and Captains from ensembles that performed in Finals should assemble near the West tunnel in preparation for Finals Awards Retreat.

# Moving from Prelims to Finals:

- **Prop Movement:** After performances props may be stored on the stadium North Apron, in the area indicated on the Flow Of Show Map. Props may be re-staged after performance. After exiting through the East tunnel, turn left before exiting Through the East gate.
- Notification: Bands that advance to Finals and are scheduled to perform in the first five time slots will be privately notified by NWAPA officials ahead of Prelims Awards Retreat so that performance preparations can be made in a timely manner.

#### Video:

• Each performance will be recorded and distributed to directors via NWAPA.

#### **Inclement Weather and Air Quality:**

While "It never rains in Autzen Stadium," we do have plans for inclement weather. In most cases, the festival will run rain or shine. If we do get poor weather, we will monitor conditions with NWAPA officials and make adjustments to the schedule as necessary to ensure the safety of participants and guests.

The University of Oregon uses the Lane Regional Air Protection Agency (LRAPA.org) and AirNow.gov as our primary source of air quality information. If the Air Quality Index (AQI) is below 100, the festival will continue as scheduled. If the AQI rises above 100 we will make an announcement suggesting the use of an N95 mask for people with underlying health conditions. If the AQI rises above 200 we will need to postpone or cancel the festival. These decisions will be made in consultation with NWAPA personnel. Please note that the guidelines may be different for your specific schools.
